ENGLAND'S FIRST BEER BREWERS, 1418-1480

VANCE MEAD AND ROSEMARY SIMONS

The brewing of beer using hops was introduced in England during the 15th century by Dutch and German brewers. The purpose of this paper is to use the plea rolls of the Court of Common Pleas to show who some of these brewers were and where they lived. These data also show a transition from Dutch and German beer brewers to a predominantly English industry in the 1460s.

Common pleas

The Court of Common Pleas was the largest of the Common Law courts at that time. It was for civil cases between subjects for recovering land, collecting debts, and suing for trespass (a wrong done, as in 'Forgive us our trespasses.') The plea rolls record the stages of a lawsuit from the original complaint by the plaintiff to the point where the case went to trial by jury. Issues of law were dealt with before the justices in Westminster Hall during term time; issues of fact were decided by juries before justices on circuit in the counties between terms. The four law terms were Hilary, Easter, Trinity, and Michaelmas, or winter, spring, summer, and autumn.

Common Pleas and other legal records dating back to 1200 have been photographed under licence from The National Archives and put online by the University of Houston at Anglo-American Legal Tradition (A.A.L.T., see http://aalt.law.uh.edu). To make these records more accessible, Rosemary Simons and I have indexed 57 law terms (so far) between 1381 and 1554; 27 of these terms are in the 15th century. The middling sort of people

The plea rolls of the Court of Common Pleas are valuable because they record a wide range of people. In each term during this period there are 5,000 to 6,000 entries, with about 15 to 20 thousand names, most also identified by dwelling place and occupation. Professor Robert Palmer of A.A.L.T. has calculated that about 70% of defendants in 1465 were labourers, husbandmen, yeomen, and 'men of occupation' such as butchers, bakers, and brewers.

The first generations of beer brewers

In the law terms indexed so far, 53 people have been found from 1418 to 1480 whose occupation is given as 'beer brewer' and once 'beer maker'. Hundreds more are identified only as 'brewer'. Ale brewing and beer brewing were separate professions. Ale brewers were not allowed to use hops, but beer brewers were free to do so. For comparison, in Easter term 1430 there were three beer brewers and 54 brewers: 24 brewers dwelt in London and Middlesex; eight in Bristol and Somerset; six in Wiltshire (five of them in Salisbury); six in Essex and Hertfordshire; two in Oxford; two in Bishop's Lynn; two in Kent and Surrey; and one each in York, Worcester, Staffordshire, and Lincolnshire. The prominence of London is explained both by its size and the ease of bringing lawsuits from there to Westminster. Few cases came from Northumberland, Cumberland,

and Westmorland, and none from Lancashire, Cheshire, and Durham, which had separate legal systems. The predominance of the larger towns must be due to the 40 shilling limit on lawsuits in the Court of Common Pleas: the village alewife rarely had trade of that size.

The East of England

If one were to draw a line from Sussex to York, all of the beer brewers in this survey would be found to the east of that line. 20 of them are found in the counties of Suffolk, Norfolk, Essex, and Hertford; 16 are in Surrey, Kent, and Sussex; nine in London and Middlesex, and eight in Yorkshire and Lincolnshire. One of these, William Peuter or Peutere, is recorded in Canterbury and Lydd, Kent, as well as in St. Osyth, Essex. For the purposes of these calculations he is included in Kent.

The usual points of entry for people and innovations coming from the Low Countries were East Anglia, London, and the Cinque Ports, hence the prevalence of hopped beer in these areas in the 15th century. This was also true of other innovations, such as the New Draperies in the 16th century. This was the name given to textiles introduced by Flemings, particularly in East Anglia and Kent.

Dutch or German beer brewers

16 beer brewers with German or Dutch names were found. In most of these cases, a surname such as Ducheman makes identification simple. In some cases, a name such as Alardson, Doys, or Derykson can be identified using the database at England's Immigrants. (See https://www.englandsimmigrants.com/)

Ten of these immigrant beer brewers are found in the period 1418 to 1465 and six in the years 1468 to 1480. In some cases, a surname such as Johnson or Broun might be either English or an Anglicised version of a German name. In these cases (with the exception of Herman Johnson) I have included them among the English. Six beer brewers, surnamed Berebrewer, must be classified as 'Uncertain', though I suspect that they were probably recent immigrants. If this is the case, then the figures are 13 Dutch beer brewers to 1465 and nine from 1468.

Predominantly English after 1465

31 of the beer brewers, judging by their surnames, are English. Of these, seven are found in and before 1465, and 24 in 1468 and afterwards. The 1460s must therefore be seen as a watershed in the change from an industry that was mainly in the hands of immigrants to one that was predominantly English.
